► **What is this project about?**

The Historic Resources Code Project will propose changes to how the City of Portland identifies, designates, and protects significant historic resources. A 2016 Oregon State Supreme Court ruling and recently-adopted changes to state administrative rules have opened opportunities to improve Portland's historic resource protection program and to better steward the city's cultural and architectural heritage. Zoning code chapters 33.445, Historic Resource Overlay Zone, and 33.846, Historic Resource Reviews, will be the most affected by this project. The project will not inventory or designate additional resources, develop district-specific design guidelines or standards, offer financial incentives for owners of historic resources, or propose changes to regulations outside of the zoning code.

► **How will my comments be used?**

Comments on the Historic Resources Code Project will be directed to City staff, who will incorporate public feedback as they develop zoning code concepts for consideration by the Portland Historic Landmarks Commission and Planning and Sustainability Commission. Draft code will be released in spring 2018, and interested parties will be invited to submit additional comments prior to public hearings in summer 2018.
