BUREAU NOTES

Overview

PF&R promotes a safe environment for all people who live and work in Portland and the surrounding areas. It provides an extensive range of public safety services including fire prevention; public education; response to fire, medical, and other emergency incidents. In FY 2013-14, PF&R has 718 full-time employees (FTE) and an adopted budget of approximately \$111 million.

Each fire & rescue station is responsible for a specific part of the city called a Fire Management Area (FMA). Services are delivered 24 hours a day, 365 days a year from 30 stations strategically located to protect and provide equitable response throughout the city. Stations overlap and support one another to ensure seamless response.

Specialized operations are provided from designated stations throughout the city, including: hazardous materials response; marine operations; dive rescue; trench rescue; high-angle rope rescue; confined space rescue; shipboard firefighting; high-rise firefighting; and CBRNE (chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive) responses.

Allocation Methodology

For the purpose of this expenditure mapping, PF&R's costs are allocated by the total number of incidents including both fire and emergency medical services calls in each of the district coalitions.

Map Discussion

The East and Central City district coalitions have the highest costs in both total and when normalized (by residents + jobs) because these two areas have the highest number of incidents.

Unallocated expenses include citywide prevention activities such as Investigations, Plan Review, and Fire Alarms.
