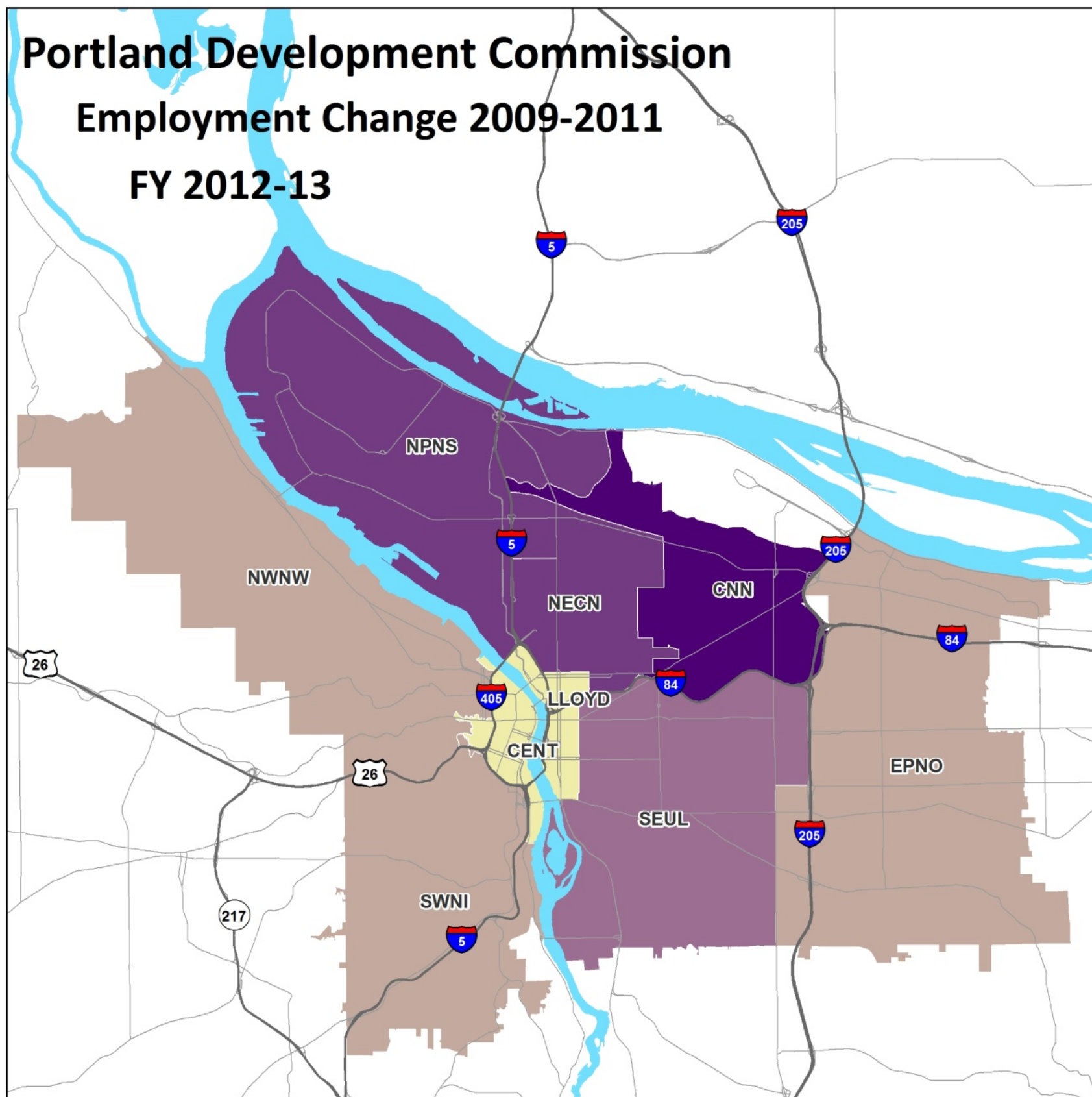

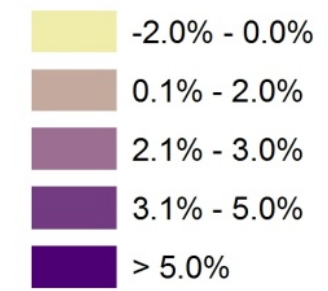
2009 – 2011 Employment Change

The Portland Development Commission's leadership in economic development resulted in City Council's adoption of Portland's first Economic Development Strategy in more than 15 years in June 2009.
