**15** Authorize Portland Housing Bureau to assume certain contracts that will be assigned to the Bureau in connection with the acquisition of the Ellington Apartments

**CBO Analysis:** Through Ordinance 188175 and resolution 37261, Council authorized the budgeting and temporary transfer of \$51 million in funds to support the Ellington Apartments purchase and improvements. The purchase cost was approved by Council at \$47 million, leaving \$4 million in discretionary appropriated funding which could be used towards services costs of these third party contractors. The bureau had initially estimated \$915,000 in closing and pre-funded accounts costs, \$5.96 million in needed structural or immediate repairs, and will also need to retain enough funding to pay interest on the \$51 million interfund loan.

**NOTE:** “Time Certain” indicates that an item will not be heard by Council **prior** to the time specified.

Communications items are three minutes each. Regular Agenda items taking longer than five minutes have the time estimate noted next to the item.

The \* indicates an emergency ordinance, which takes effect immediately if passed. Non-emergency ordinances require two readings and a 30-day waiting period before taking effect. Resolutions, reports, etc., adopted by Council are effective after adjournment.
