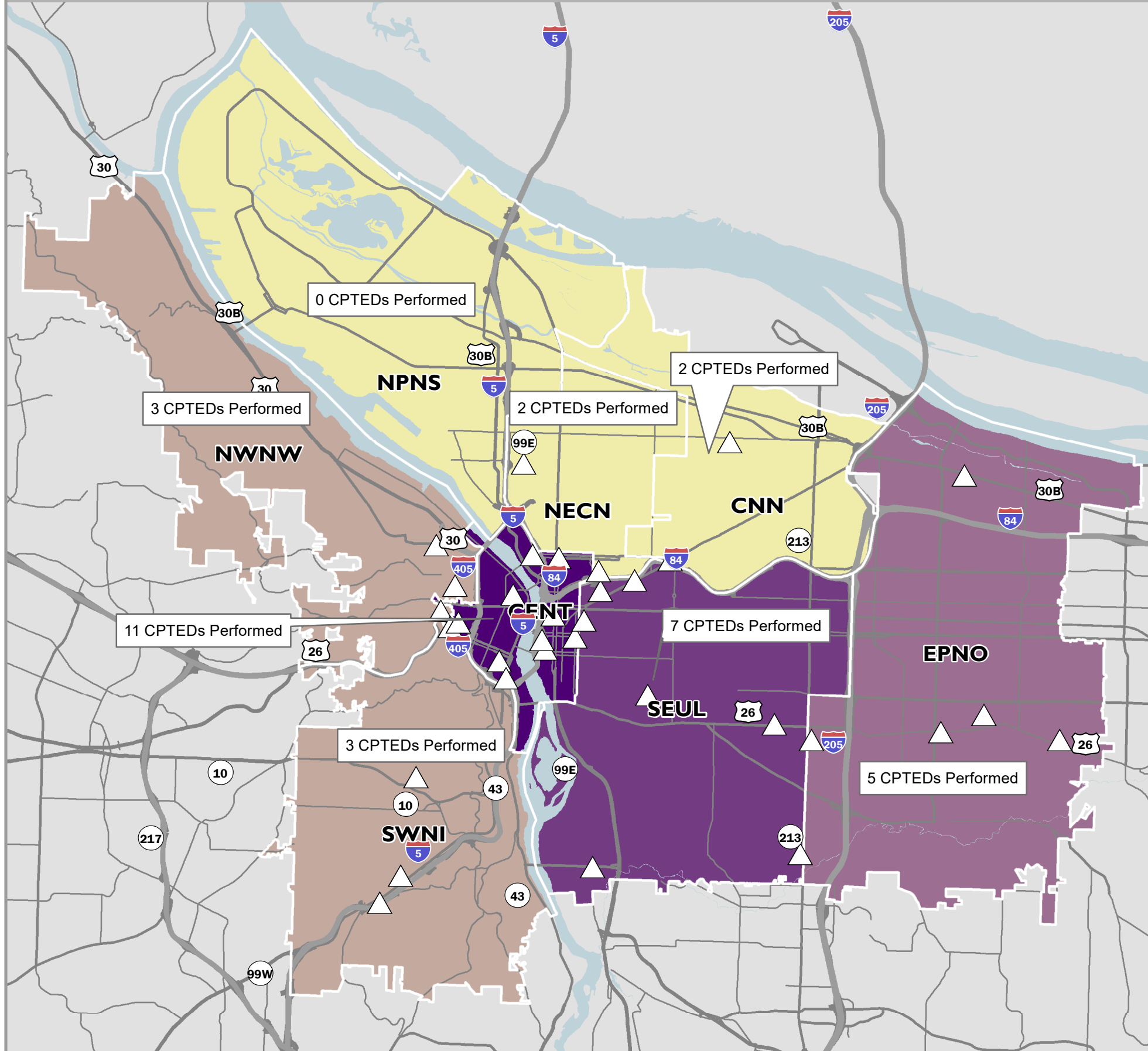


Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design Assessments

BUREAU NOTES

Overview

Portland's crime prevention services are offered through the Office of Neighborhood Involvement's, Crime Prevention team and are designed to reduce crime, increase livability, and get neighbors involved in community policing efforts. These services are provided by Crime Prevention Coordinators who are assigned to neighborhoods throughout the city. The services provided to the community by the City of Portland's Crime Prevention Coordinators (CPCs) fall into three broad areas: education, community organizing, and training on issues of crime and livability. Level of Service

Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) is the proper design, maintenance, and use of the built environment to enhance the quality of life, and reduce the incidence and fear of crime. CPTED review is helpful when landscaping, lighting, security vulnerabilities and other environmental factors are attracting criminal or problem activity. When this is the case, Crime Prevention may conduct a property assessment with a responsible party, property manager or property owner who is willing and authorized to follow through on the recommendations. When the recommendations are provided to the responsible party, it is up to the property manager or owner to determine what recommendations are implemented. 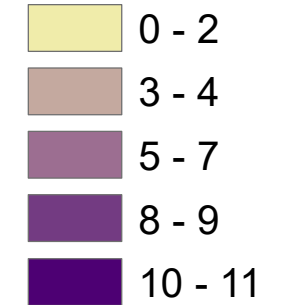
Map Discussion

Mapped CPTED assessments are only representative of assessments conducted. In some cases certain factors (costs, structural design, neighboring buildings, etc.) can limit effectiveness and implementation. Marked assessments do not indicate implementation of CPTED recommendations. CPTED is one tool that can be used effectively, especially when done in combination with other strategies. While more CPTEDs have been done in the Central city area, ONI is hoping to support more robust programming in this area and follow-up to see how many of the recommendations were implemented, and what might be some barriers to implement.
