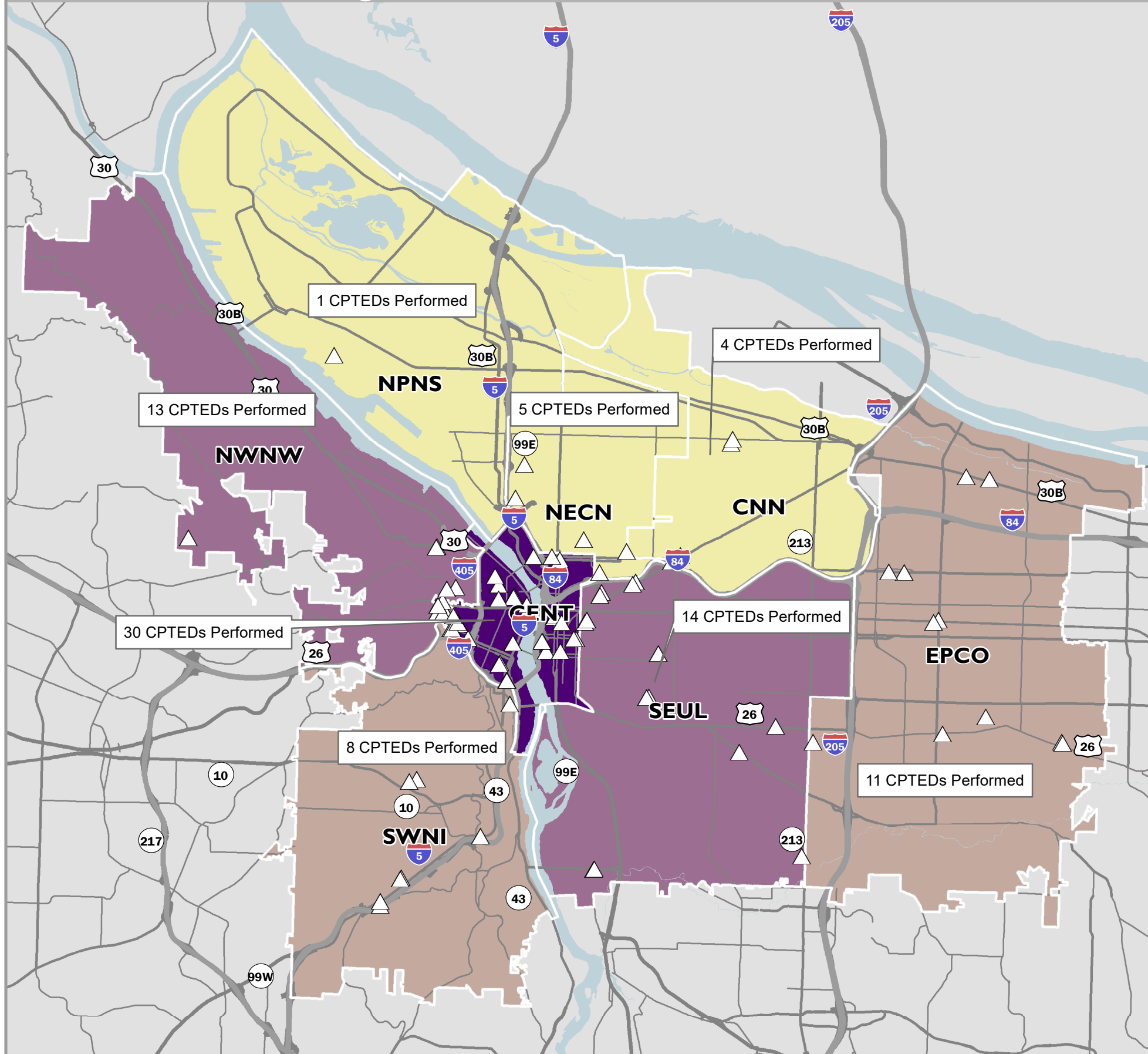


Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) Assessments

BUREAU NOTES

Overview

Many of Portland's public safety education services are offered through the City of Portland, Office of Community & Civic Life, Crime Prevention Program. These services are provided by three teams of Crime Prevention Coordinators who are assigned to specific regions throughout the city. The services fall into three broad areas: public safety education, community organizing, and connecting community to public safety resources. Level of Service

Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) is the proper design, maintenance, and use of the built environment to enhance the quality of life, and reduce the incidence and fear of crime. CPTED review is helpful when landscaping, lighting, security vulnerabilities and other environmental factors are attracting criminal or problem activity. When this is the case, Crime Prevention may conduct a property assessment with a responsible party, property manager or property owner who is willing and authorized to follow through on the recommendations. When the recommendations are provided to the responsible party, it is up to the property manager or owner to determine what recommendations are implemented. 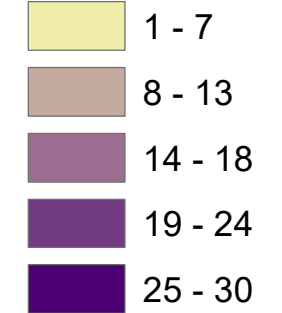
Map Discussion

Mapped CPTED assessments are only representative of assessments conducted. In some cases certain factors (costs, structural design, neighboring buildings, etc.) can limit effectiveness and implementation. Marked assessments do not indicate implementation of CPTED recommendations. CPTED is one tool that can be used effectively, especially when done in combination with other strategies. While more CPTEDs have been done in the Central city area, Civic Life is hoping to support more robust programming in this area and follow-up to see how many of the recommendations were implemented, and what might be some barriers to implement.
