Project Type: 92 organizations funded to date. 52% (48 of 92) organizations are addressing outreach to or engagement with underrepresented organizations defined as people of color, immigrant/refugee, low-income, youth and people with disabilities. Numerous projects address multiple project types affecting different constituency groups, resulting in total in percentages exceeding 100%.
