1. Please describe how your business will ensure that no one under the age of 21 is admitted, and how your business will educate patrons on the risks of marijuana use by minors.

No one under the age of 21 is allowed to enter or access Vessel inc. When a patient or customer first enters Vessel, a valid government ID must be shown to be checked in the lobby / waiting room for date of birth and expiration of license by Vessel trained employees. If their ID is expired or under the age of 21 they are asked to leave the property. All vendors and service people are also required to sign our vendor/service log.

*On the door to the retail point of sale area a sign is posted stating that it is a "Restricted Access Area-No Minors Allowed".

*The appropriate labeling from the OLCC is placed on all sold products also with the warning label "WARNING: Recreational use - KEEP OUT OF THE REACH OF CHILDREN".

*For customers that are from out of the country we require that they show their valid up to date passport.

* We have the the poster from the OLCC informing on how to educate before they recreate

* Vessel uses child safe packaging that is approved by the Oregon medical marijuana program, and the OLCC. We also have everything labeled stating that these products should be kept out of the reach of children and the risk of use during pregnancy. With every purchase we hand out a card explaining "Marijuana can make kids sick" to every customer explaining the potential risks. Also hanging on the wall are three "Educate Before You Recreate" posters up in th

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2. Please describe how your business will prevent cannabis products from being consumed around or near your business.

Vessel notifies each patron during the transaction that marijuana consumption in public is against the law. We also remind them that they need to wait and consume when they arrive home and to not consume after leaving the store. We also have a sign hanging on the door to remind them as they leave not to consume marijuana in public.

Our employees monitor our video surveillance as people are arriving and leaving through out the day to make sure no one is consuming marijuana on the premises or in our neighborhood.

3. Please describe how your business will prevent and address potential negative impacts to neighborhood livability such as noise, parking, garbage, or loitering from your patrons.

Vessel is located in an industrial zone that does not contain residential occupants. We have been open since March of 2015 and we have never encountered any problems during that time. Our employees also do a daily sweep of the exterior of Vessel in the beginning of the day and during closing. We also keep a trash can near the door for customers to throw away their trash upon entering or exiting. Vessel has a private parking area and there is free street parking.

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4. Please briefly describe your business's process to respond to and resolve complaints and/or concerns from neighboring businesses or residences.

We have good relations with the surrounding businesses, and many are our customers. If there is a complaint we will immediately find the best form of communication for the m. We would either call, visit face to face, or email them to listen to their concerns, and to offer solutions and compromise. We are very happy to appease anyones complaints and to continue a positive experience for the neighborhood.

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Marijuana Control Plan - Question 1

To prevent theft, robberies, burglaries, and shoplifting is a top priority of Vessel. It is one of our top priorities to keep our customers, employees and neighborhood safe.

*Alarm System - We use Portland security alarm and Alarm.com to monitor Vessel 24 hours a day. In an event of alarm the security company calls the owners on the call list in order of priority to see if further action is need by calling the Police authority. Our Portland Police Alarm Permit number is P120979.

*Security System Detail - We have installed an 8 channel security system on the property. 2 cameras are positioned outside for capturing images of the customers entering from two angles. Also 6 cameras are positioned on the interior to captures customers entering the facility and during all of the transactions. During the closed hours at Vessel we have motion detectors installed in each room and a glass break sensor in the front room. A diagnostic check of the security and battery back up is done once a week.

*Video Entrance and Panic Buttons - For the safety of the employees we have installed multiple panic buttons in the point of sale location and counter work area. There is also a video door bell allowing the employee to see and communicate to the potential customer before they enter. Our video storage is capable of 30 days.

*To Maintain live inventory at Vessel, we uses Green Bits as our point of sale system.

*Inventory is done daily to maintain that there is no variances in product quantities, Vessel has two scales that are certified by the Oregon department of agriculture.

*The manager is required to make regular cash drops during the day in the safe.

*To also control the flow of customers a 3:1 customer to employee ratio is allowed in the store at a time.

*To prevent shop lifting all of the products are stored behind the glass at the counter and on a hanging shelving unit behind the counter. Not all of the products in their full quantity are placed out on the retail store during the day, the majority of the product is kept locked in the safe. Also at the end of the day everything is put back in the safe for storage.

*Employees are responsible to take appropriate measures to protect themselves during a robbery including staying calm and obeying the suspects orders, repeating the orders back to the suspect before acting and during this time calmly pressing the panic button. They are also responsible to assist with law enforcement procedures and requests.
