RECAP: LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

- Must meet local code requirements, including but not limited to building and fire codes (Commercial Building Permit, Electrical Permit, Mechanical Permit, etc.)
- 1000 ft. buffer between consumer-based businesses (Medical Dispensaries & Marijuana Retailers)
- 1000 ft. buffer from Schools
- Zoning requirements (NO licenses for businesses in Residential Zones RF-RH)
- Meet all state and local regulations that apply
- Security Alarm Permit
- Registration with Oregon's Business Registry
- City of Portland Business License Certificate of Compliance
- Verification from property owner approving use as a Medical Dispensary or Marijuana Business
- Proof of State license
- Submit complete application including required documentation
