Application for the above has been reviewed by the Noise Control Officer, City of Portland, and is hereby:

### Approved, with the following conditions:

Nighttime construction activities will comply with ORS 467, OAR 340-035, all other applicable laws and regulations, and to the extent feasible, the following construction noise abatement measures:

- A. No construction will be performed within 1,000 feet of an occupied dwelling on Sundays, and legal holidays.
- B. Equipment will use sound control devices no less effective than those provided on the original equipment. Equipment with un-muffled exhausts is prohibited.
- C. Equipment will comply with pertinent equipment noise standards of the EPA.

If a specific noise impact complaint is received, one or more of the following noise mitigation measures may be employed:

1. Stationary construction equipment will be located as far from nearby noise sensitive properties as feasible.
2. Idling equipment will be shut off.
3. Construction operations will be rescheduled to avoid periods of noise annoyance identified in the complaint.
4. Nearby residents will be notified whenever extremely noisy work will be occurring.
5. Temporary or portable acoustic barriers will be installed around stationary construction noise sources.
6. Electric-powered equipment will be operated using line voltage power or solar power.

The Applicant shall be prepared to develop a noise mitigation plan with the Noise Control Office should complaints arise.

In addition to the mitigation measures listed above, per requirements from the City of Portland Noise Review Board and the City of Portland Noise Control Officer, there will be a 24-hour telephone response line (Hot Line) available. The Project Manager shall investigate complaints and develop information necessary to address complaints within 24 hours or before the next scheduled night work.


All equipment will be properly maintained and operated with exhaust mufflers and meet all noise limits.

**To the Applicant:**

1. Carry this document with you during the activity. This is not a permit to make more noise than is minimally necessary for your needs.
2. Violation of the conditions of this variance constitutes grounds for revocation of the variance, and denial of future applications, and may also result in the issuance of citation(s) for violations of City Code.
3. **If a Police or Noise Control Officer should appear, his/her instructions will supersede this variance and take precedence.**
