Accessing Online Crime Statistics and Other Resources

Office of Neighborhood Involvement Crime Prevention Program

The City, County, State and Federal government publish crime data and statistics that are available to the public online. These resources sort and capture data in different ways. Data and statistics may reveal what is going on locally and beyond, and influence your crime prevention strategies. Statistical accuracy is reliant on the willingness of victims to report crime. The data also needs to be understood in a larger context. For example, the Portland Police Bureau introduced online reporting a few years ago for a limited number of crimes. Portland residents increasingly use this tool to report car prowls, which has historically been a significantly under reported crime. An increase in this type of crime following the tool's release may be partially explained by an increased willingness of victims to report car prowls now that there's an online reporting option.

The resources listed below include crime statistics for Portland, Multnomah County, Oregon and the United States, police calls for service, sex offender registries, inmate data and comparative statistics.

City of Portland Information:

Monthly Neighborhood Offense Statistics

In this Portland Police Bureau database, users can view crime statistics for Portland neighborhoods. The tool also allows the user to download incident data for neighborhoods. For instructions on how to use the site, select Dashboard Walkthrough on the following website.

Also included on the webpage below are data for historical crime statistics, traffic, pedestrian and bicycle stops, officer-involved shootings, in-custody deaths and use of force.

Map of Crime Incidents

A web-based Geographic Information System (GIS) that maps out crimes reported to the Portland Police Bureau. By inputting a Portland address and selecting the Public Safety tab along with person, property or societal crime category, the system will map out crimes for that category within a 1/4 mile area for the last year.

Map of Calls for Service

CrimeReports is a crime mapping website that pulls data for police calls to 9-1-1 and the non-emergency number from law enforcement agencies. The system maps out police calls for service that have occurred for the address entered, type of crime identified at the time of the call and time frame selected by the user. Calls for service data may differ from actual crime statistics when a caller who reports an incident to dispatch has a different perception of what is happening at a location than what is determined by the police officers responding to that call. VINELink is a resource that allows users to search for the custody status of an offender. Users may also register to be notified automatically when an offender is released or transferred, escapes or undergoes changes to his/her parole or probation status.

A report compiled from the data of approximately 17,000 law enforcement agencies across the United States. Statistics reflect actual crimes reported to law enforcement agencies, and information is available at the national, state, regional, and city level.

Data on personal and household victimization collected by the US Bureau of Justice Statistics. The NCVS is the primary source of information on the characteristics of criminal victimization and on the number and types of crimes not reported to law enforcement authorities.
