▪ Recommendation 1: Universal Representation Fund

- i. Financial
 - Task Force agreed on \$5M as a floor for the City to seed the Fund and requested the City to coordinate efforts between County, State, private foundations, etc. to raise additional funds
 - Task Force agreed that it was more important to present a framework to build a budget rather than setting a number

 - Task Force agreed that the City would need to expend considerable social and political capital especially to coordinate and encourage other agencies and governments to join effort
