Application for the above has been reviewed by the Noise Control Officer, City of Portland, and is hereby:

Approved, with the following conditions:

- A. The variance shall run from July 1, 2018 through May 31, 2019. The hours of the variances construction shall be from 10:00 pm.m. to 5:00 a.m.
- B. All equipment will be properly maintained and operated with exhaust mufflers and will meet all noise limits.
- C. All equipment will follow the equipment noise standards provided by the US Environmental Protection Agency.
- D. The contractor will have portable noise monitoring equipment available onsite during nighttime work and have staff knowledgeable on maintaining and using the equipment.
- E. Notice shall be given to the neighborhood residents. The notice will include a contact person and phone number for construction noise issues. Notices will be delivered to all buildings within a 2 block radius of the construction work. The notice shall include the nature of the work and the anticipated noise sources that neighbors will hear during the period of the variances work activity.


- F. ODOT will provide a 24-hour hotline available to nearby residents to record and respond to nighttime construction complaints. A site representative will respond to all complaints within 24 hours of the complaint.
- G. The Applicant will send complaint reports along with a complaint log and details of how the problem was resolved to the City of Portland Noise Control Officer. These logs can be emailed to the Noise Office at noise@portlandoregon.gov.
- H. In the event of nighttime construction noise complaints, the contractor will be required to construct or erect temporary noise barriers or shields to limit construction noise from stationary or slow-moving noise sources.
- I. The noise variance will be reviewed upon receipt of complaints. If complaints are filed, the Noise Control Officer may modify the variance, as needed, to resolve community noise disturbances.
- J. All haul trucks will meet or exceed the standards outlined in Chapter 34, Section 35 of the Oregon Administrative Rules, Oregon Department of Environmental Quality, April 1983.
- K. The ODOT project manager will insure compliance with any and all mitigation measures.

To the Applicant:

1. Carry this document with you during the activity. This is not a permit to make more noise than is minimally necessary for your needs.
2. Violation of the conditions of this variance constitutes grounds for revocation of the variance, and denial of future applications, and may also result in the issuance of citation(s) for violations of City Code.
3. **If a Police or Noise Control Officer should appear, his/her instructions will supersede this variance and take precedence.**
