Application for the above has been reviewed by the Noise Control Officer, City of Portland, and is hereby:

Approved, with the following conditions:


- A. Speakers are to face away from the closest residential locations.
- B. Amplification shall not be audible further than a block from the source of the noise.
- C. Sound level checks for audibility as described by the Noise Control Officer will be completed every 30 minutes. They will be completed at the intersection of N LOMBARD and N McKENNA; a second location to check for audibility will be at N HOUGHTON and N FORTUNE. The applicant shall maintain a written log of the times of checks for compliance at each location and if the sound was in compliance or if it had to be reduced.
- D. Sound levels will be reduced upon request.
- E. Amplification is to cease at 6:00 p.m. SHARP.
- F. Applicant will supply notification of the event to all neighbors within a two block radius prior to the event. Notification will include a phone number that neighbors can call to reach the Applicant to discuss questions before the event and to report concerns of excessive noise during the event. Notice should not simply include the residents who live right on that block, but is intended to reach other neighbors who are impacted by the request for a noise variance.
- G. All future requests will require community notice at least 14 calendar days before the event.
- H. Applicant will notify the Noise Office at (503) 823-7350 of any complaints they receive. The Applicant will keep a record of how they responded to concerns raised by the community in order to report their actions back to the Noise Control Office.

To the Applicant:

1. Carry this document with you during the activity. This is not a permit to make more noise than is minimally necessary for your needs.
2. Violation of the conditions of this variance constitutes grounds for revocation of the variance, and denial of future applications, and may also result in the issuance of citation(s) for violations of City Code.
3. **If a Police or Noise Control Officer should appear, his/her instructions will supersede this variance and take precedence.**
