## Proposed Amendment to Bureau of Fire and Police Disability and Retirement Administrative Rules

The Bureau of Fire and Police Disability and Retirement (FPDR) proposes amendments to Section 5.4 of the FPDR Administrative Rules pertaining to:

- Tax Offset Benefit – to comply with Ordinance No. 188053, passed by Council on October 26, 2016.
- Alternate Payee Benefits – to comply with Ordinance No. 187905, passed by Council on July 20, 2016.
- Final Pay (27-Pay Period) – to comply with Ordinance No. 188016, passed by Council on October 6, 2016 and Ordinance No. 188089, passed by Council on November 17, 2016.
