1. Independent Police Review (IPR) Work Plan / Accomplishments

IPR Welcomes New Investigator

Marc Addington joined IPR in October and is an experienced investigator with experience working in multiple jurisdiction including Chicago, the City of Atlanta, and Fulton County, Georgia. With the hiring of Mr. Addington, IPR now has a team of seven full-time investigators.

Community Outreach

IPR Community Outreach Coordinator Irene Konev attended and networked at the Portland State University Center for Women's Leadership Luncheon, Incite Job Fair, Reverse Networking Trade Fair, East Portland Advocates for Youth Networking, Warner Pacific College, Global Educations Series, and at Milenio 2016, a fundraiser for Latino civic engagement. IPR Director Constantin Severe and Investigator Casey Bieberich also met with the policy director of Urban League.

Auditor All -Staff Equity Training

The City Auditor's Office participated in an all-staff equity training. The Racial Equity Toolkit Development training helped build on knowledge and skills already in place and provided tools to communicate about race. With the support of the Office of Equity and Human Rights, the training was led by Center for Social Inclusion staff, providing guidance on using the racial equity toolkit as it applies to our work in government auditing and accountably. This training empowered the staff to find new ways to communicate about race and strategies on implementing the Racial Equity Toolkit to our daily work.
