**Significant Events from the First Quarter of 2017**

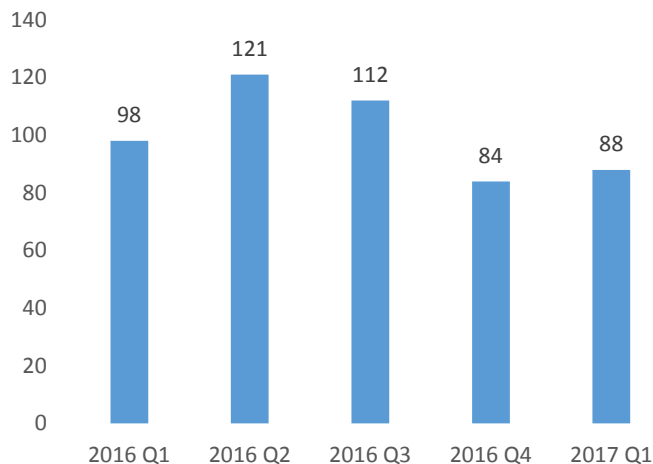
- IPR opened six cases as a result of citizen complaints connected to protests in January and February. These complaints alleged misconduct in officers’ use of force (7 allegations), failure to follow procedure (2), and lack of courtesy (1).
- IPR independent investigations of former Chief O’Dea and his Assistant Chiefs were finished in the first quarter.
- In February, City Council heard an appeal of an investigation for the first time in 14 years. Council members voted 3-2 for a finding of not sustained that a Police Bureau officer used inappropriate force to take a community member into custody.

**First Quarter Community Complaints Data**

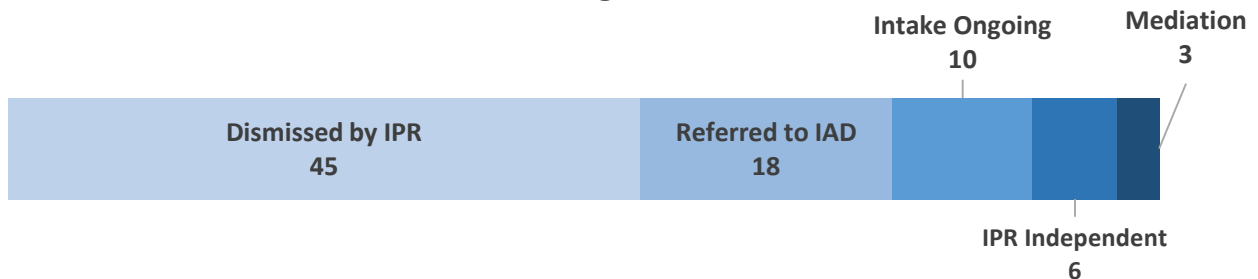
IPR and Internal Affairs received 88 community complaints during January, February, and March of 2017. This was ten fewer complaints than the first quarter of last year and below 2016’s quarterly average of 104 complaints.

Eighty-two of the complaints were received by IPR and six of the complaints came through Internal Affairs. Of the IPR complaints, six IPR independent investigations have been initiated and intake is ongoing for 10 complaints. Forty-five complaints were dismissed by IPR, most commonly because no misconduct was identified.

Q1 2016 - Q1 2017**

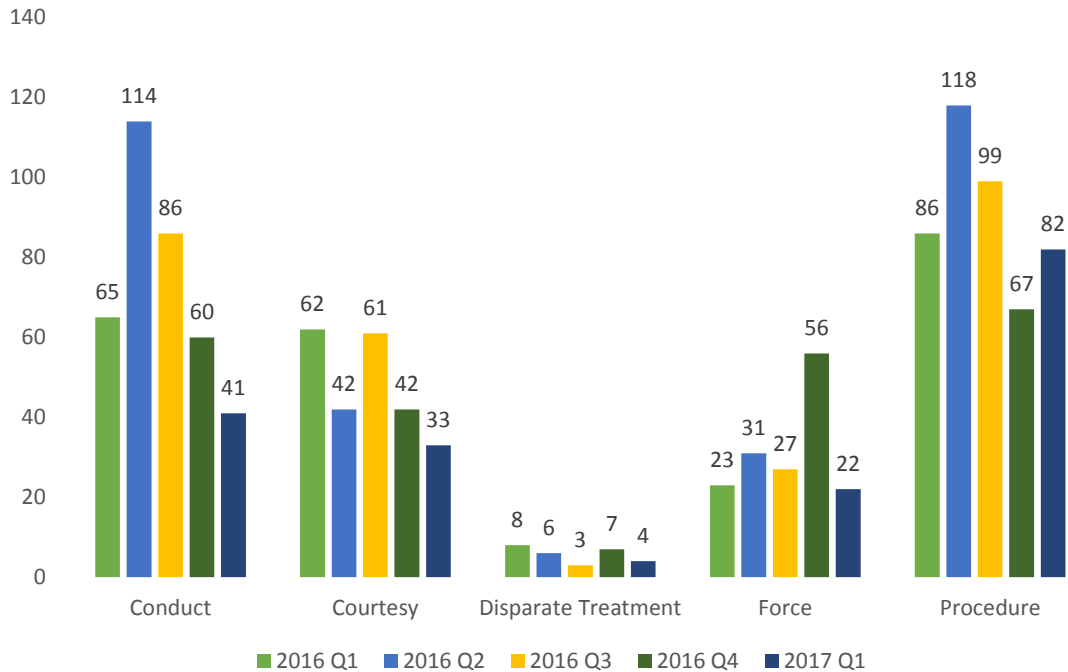


**IPR Screening of Q1 2017 Cases**



Though many cases are still in progress and additional allegations will likely be added, community complaints made in the first quarter of 2017 contained 182 allegations as of May 30.

### Findings Completed in the First Quarter

Findings were completed for fifty-one allegations (from 16 cases) in the first quarter of 2017. Thirty-five percent (18) of those allegations were sustained.
