### 1. Independent Police Review (IPR) Work Plan / Accomplishments

#### IPR Staff Ride-Alongs

IPR staff is committed to annual ride-alongs with Portland Police officers. More than half of the IPR staff have completed their annual ride-along with the rest to be completed before the end of the year.

#### Police Review Board Appointments

After many months of volunteer recruitment, selection and training, IPR presented 12 new and returning volunteers to Portland City Council for appointment to begin their three-year terms. This volunteer board is a rich reflection of Portland's diverse community.

#### Citizen Review Committee Recruitment

The Citizen Review Committee recruitment ended on September 26<sup>th</sup> and IPR received 13 applications. Applicants are being interviewed in mid-November.

#### Outreach

IPR Senior Community Outreach Coordinator Irene Konev reached out to organizations, community leaders and individuals for the Citizen Review Committee recruitment.

She networked at Community Peace Collaborative, Simple X Mixer, Oregon Assembly for Black Affairs Quarterly Meeting, Native American Youth and Family Center Neerchokikoo Powwow, Serbian Festival, Noche Bella Latino Network, Portland Committee for Community-Engaged Policing Meeting, Pro Bono and Community Service Fair at Lewis & Clark Law School, South East Public Safety Committee Meeting, Center for Women's Leadership "Annual Power Luncheon, Breaking Bread and Barriers Networking Dinner and at Sisters of the Road.

IPR held a community forum at Sisters of the Road to discuss IPR and Audit Services' recent work on homelessness issues. IPR Director Ross Caldwell, Deputy Director Dana Walton-Macaulay, IPR



Investigator Eric Nomura and IPR Policy & Outreach Coordinator KC Jones attended and heard from staff and customers of Sisters of the Road. Portland City Auditor Mary Hull Caballero, Caldwell, Walton -Macaulay and Konev met with executive director of Unite Oregon. The same also attended and gave a presentation on the IPR commendation/complaint process at the Immigrant & Refugee Community Organization all-staff meeting. Citizen Review Committee member Jihane Nami also presented to Immigrant & Refugee Community Organization on the role of the volunteer committee at the all staff meeting.
