### Independent Police Review (IPR) Work Plan / Accomplishments

#### IPR Operations During COVID

Due to the ongoing public health crisis, all IPR staff are working remotely. Although the IPR office is closed to in-person visits, investigators are available to accept complaints online, by phone or by mail.

#### Incoming Cases

IPR has received 191 total community contacts since May 29<sup>th</sup>. Of those, 113 are related to protests. This is not including several thousand form letters and more general contacts. IPR has opened 51 investigations so far.

#### Policy Reviews

IPR will be releasing a review of PPB's Weapon Flashlight Policy in the next few weeks. It is currently in the review process and should be released before the end of July.

#### Outreach

##### CRC Recruitment

The next CRC recruitment has been launched and outreach is going strong. The CRC application has been shared widely by IPR allies, is posted on the IPR website and found in CRC section of the website at this [link](#). Current CRC members whose term are expiring are encouraged to reapply. The application deadline is Friday July 31<sup>st</sup> at 5:00 pm.

##### Community Outreach



IPR Senior Community Outreach Coordinator Irene Konev connected with many organizations and is setting up meetings for IPR directors through July and August. She engaged with Q Center, Catholic Charities of Oregon – Housing Transitions Program, JOIN, Latino Network, Africa House, Oregon Assembly for Black Affairs, Urban League, Muslim Advisory Council, Slavic Advisory Council, Vancouver Avenue First Baptist Church, Disability Rights Oregon, Accent Russian TV and Disability Rights Oregon. She also attended the Community Peace Collaborative meeting and Women in IT networking event.
