Green Cleaning

Did you know some of the most toxic products in our homes and workplaces are cleaning products? They can be harmful to both people and the environment.

According to the EPA, using green cleaners can reduce:

- Skin irritation caused by contact with toxic chemicals
- Air pollution by reducing the use of VOC's
- Unnecessary additives such as fragrances and dyes
- Packaging waste
- Exposure to concentrates

METRO has a great **Green Cleaning** web site with suggestions for making and using less toxic cleaners, soaps, deodorizers, disinfectants, stain removers, etc. They also have other tips for a less toxic household and shopping tips for buying safer off the shelf products.

You can also download a copy of the Hazardless home Handbook, which is a joint publication of METRO and DEQ, and has additional information including disposal options.
