OMF Labor Management Committee Meeting Recap
August 16, 2018

Decisions:

- The meeting was chaired by Tom Rinehart.

Discussion:

- The committee shared updates from other OMF LMCs.
 - BTS is prepping for the annual BTS picnic and pursuing speed of trust initiatives.
 - Facilities hired an additional Maintenance Technician and a new Operations Manager.
 - P&D is cross-training its staff in light of staff vacations.
 - Revenue's Office for Community Technology is becoming its own bureau. A new staffer will be brought on board to oversee Revenue's Rental Registration Program.
- An update on vacation leave accruals was provided.
 - Effective Jan. 1, 2019; all City employees will accrue more vacation leave. This action places the City at market rate for vacation accrual.
 - The vacation accrual increase was the result of Labor, BHR, and Council coming together to address a shortcoming with the City's benefits package.
 - Labor and BHR are hoping to use the model used in this scenario for other bargaining needs.
- Tom Rinehart shared updates on security.
 - The security consultant (Triad) has assessed approximately 100 City-owned sites and created a master plan which contains findings and recommendations.
 - The City will use the Portland Building Reconstruction project to roll-out an enterprise security standard.
 - There are many ways to approach an enterprise security standard. Conversations with Council are needed to determine an appropriate security investment.

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
