Application for the above has been reviewed by the Noise Control Officer, City of Portland, and is hereby:

Approved, with the following conditions:

- A. Operation times for the variance dates are as follows: May 5, May 6, and May 7, 2017, from 11:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.
- B. On Friday, May 5, 2017, sound levels from 11:00 a.m. up to 11:00 p.m. may not exceed 70 dBA (peaks to 75 dBA), as measured on the west side of Naito Parkway. Sound will be measured with an A meter weighting and a FAST meter response.
- C. On Saturday, May 6, 2017, sound levels from 11:00 a.m. up to 5:00 p.m. may not exceed 65 dBA (peaks to 70 dBA), as measured on the west side of Naito Parkway. From 5:00 p.m. up to 10:00 p.m., sound levels may not exceed 70 dBA (peaks to 75 dBA), as measured on the west side of Naito Parkway. After 10:00 p.m. and up to 11:00 p.m. the level reduces by 6 dBA; therefore the event will not exceed 64 dBA with limited peaks to 69 dBA. Sound will be measured with an A meter weighting and a FAST meter response.
- D. On Sunday, May 7, 2017, sound levels from 11:00 a.m. up to 10:00 p.m. may not exceed 70 dBA (peaks to 75 dBA), as measured on the west side of Naito Parkway. After 10:00 p.m. and up to 11:00 p.m. the level reduces by 5 dBA; therefore the event will not exceed 65 dBA with limited peaks to 70 dBA. Sound will be measured with an A meter weighting and a FAST meter response.
- E. Sound level monitoring on the west side of Naito Parkway is to be performed by the applicant, or an appointed party, twice during each afternoon, and twice during each evening of the Festival. A set of sound level measurements shall include: a reading on the west side of SW Naito Parkway between SW Taylor and SW Salmon; a reading on the west side of SW Naito Parkway between

SW Pine and SW Stark; a reading on the east side of SW Naito Parkway and Ash and Ankeny. Measurements at the soundboard are to be correlated via walkie-talkie and will be included for the entire set of readings. For example, a sound level reading at Naito Parkway at 10:30 PM will have a correlating measurement at X feet from the stage for the exact same time period. Neglect to properly monitor the event can result in multiple citations.


- F. The recorded measurements are to be submitted, as a summary and legible report, to the Noise Control Office, by May 26, 2017. The person(s) monitoring sound shall also do general screening for compliance of the remaining areas along SW Naito Parkway. No sound level measurements will be required for the general monitoring. The recorded logs should be immediately available during the event for the Noise Control Officer and City staff to review.
- G. No scheduled low-rider cars are noted for this year. If they are added closer to the event date, the applicant needs to be extra sensitive of the bass levels from any low-rider cars that will be a part of cultural demonstrations. Event promoters shall closely monitor the bass levels from car stereos in the low-riders. Sound level will be reduced upon receipt of any complaint.
- H. The Applicant also needs to be sensitive of the sound levels from any radio stations that are using speakers as part of their corporate promotions or live broadcasts. Corporate amplified promotions are not part of the cultural aspects that have partially defined this event as a benefit to the education of the community. Sound levels from radio station amplification and promotions shall not exceed 64 dBA on the west side of Naito Parkway during the duration of the event.

To the Applicant:

1. Carry this document with you during the activity. This is not a permit to make more noise than is minimally necessary for your needs.
2. Violation of the conditions of this variance constitutes grounds for revocation of the variance, and denial of future applications, and may also result in the issuance of citation(s) for violations of City Code.
3. **If a Police or Noise Control Officer should appear, his/her instructions will supersede this variance and take precedence.**
