

DESIGN TEAM ROLES

- Analyze traffic impacts and parking needs for the project
- Assess the condition of the trees on site
- Estimate the probable construction cost of the project at each phase of development
- Design interpretive graphics and exhibits both interior and along interpretive trails based on community and PP&R input

- Analyze and map wetlands and stream flows on site
- Develop alternative building designs
- Analyze potential user experiences to determine elements of the program
- Create illustrative renderings of the project options
- Identify strategies for green building/sustainable design
- Connect and support PP&R staff to engage communities of color and other underrepresented groups

PP&R STAFF ROLES

- Manage communication
- Support PAC by providing up-to-date information and updates
- Manage and oversee budget and timeline goals and objectives for the Forest Park Nature & Education Center process

- Work with consultants and the community to gather a broad base of information about the community's recreational and cultural needs
- Learn about and understand how a growing diverse population impacts the future needs and design of this project
- Identify current and future opportunities and barriers to developing a successful Forest Park Entrance and Nature Center

- Work with PAC and consultants to create a shared, equitable, and inclusive vision that reflects the entire City of Portland
- Ensure that the vision of the Forest Park Entrance and Nature Center process remains vital and relevant for generations to come

PAC ROLES

- Provide input on the Forest Park Entrance and Nature Center design plan
- Ensure public perspective is honored and reflected in final product
- Represent a cross section of business, community-based, and community leaders
- Brainstorm and develop a shared, equitable, and inclusive vision that reflects the entire City of Portland

- Advocate for the project after the design plan finishes
- Balance the information received around this project, their understanding of the park, the demographic trends in the City, and etc. then provide an outcome that will benefit for the growing diverse City and for future generations to come
