



# November M/W/F 4's Sprout Newsletter

Dear Sprout M/W/F families,

Welcome to this new school year! Teacher Yonus and I have been so excited to get to know each of our new students and families. Thank you everyone for filling out the parent packets, the information has been most helpful for us to get to know and understand your child as an individual. After these first weeks, we have transitioned well into our daily routine. Generally, our daily routine has been as follows:

- 1:00-Opening Activity
- 1:15-Center Play
- 2:00-Circle Time
- 2:30-Snack
- 2:50-Outside Play
- 3:50-Goodbye Circle Time
- 4:00-Pickup

The past month we have learned about beetle's metamorphosis, falling autumn leaves, busy squirrels, and this week, migrating geese!

Preliminary assessments have begun to gauge where our students are developmentally and how best to move forward throughout the coming year. Assessments have so far included saying our ABC's and spelling our names, counting to twenty, and visual pattern recognition. Our end of the year goal is for each student to attain mastery in each of the benchmarks of Physical Well-Being and Motor Development, Social and Emotional Development, Communication, Language, and Literacy, and finally Mathematics and Science.
