The City of Portland invites you to complete a funding application for the Teen Collaborative Initiative (TCI). The focus of the TCI grant is to increase the capacity of youth service organizations to engage trauma impacted and at-risk youth in pro-social activities, and programming during out of school time, establish a learning community of youth service providers and deepen partnerships with Portland Parks & Recreation (PP&R) Teens program.

This grant funding is for July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2021. Funding for the TCI grant is not guaranteed in the next biennium. If your organization has the capacity to take on this project, interested organizations should complete the following application. Applications must be received by 5:00 pm, March 15, 2019.
Resource request decisions will be made by: May 31, 2019.

In addition, the grantees will be required to attend quarterly partner meetings facilitated by PP&R.
