- 6. NET OUTREACH WORKGROUP (NOW!):** The NET Outreach Workgroup, fondly referred to as “NOW!”, has been hard at work, building a basic preparedness presentation that you will eventually be able to take with you to neighborhood or community groups. NOW is also working on building a “Train-the-Trainer” for the preparedness presentation and some ongoing outreach training for NETs. Keep your eyes on NET newsletters for upcoming pilots and trainings. We’ll need your input to make it awesome.

- 7. NATIONAL (NET) NIGHT OUT:** Registration for National Night Out parties and events continues through **July 19**. This is a fantastic way to get to know your neighbors, invite them to be involved in your team. Get info about planning and registering your event with the Portland Office of Neighborhood Involvement: www.portlandoregon.gov/oni/nno. **National Night Out is Aug. 2**, but not all neighborhoods hold their event on that day. In your planning, consider reaching out to your neighborhood association to see if something for your area is already in the works. You might also consider doing some kind of demonstration or displaying photos to show what NET does. Maybe make it a partial Map Your Neighborhood experience: print up a large map of your street and encourage people who write their special skills/concerns on the map. A potluck of food made from emergency kit items? The opportunities are endless! Don’t forget to take photos so you can use them later to promote your team’s FUN work.
