



2019 NET PROGRAM SURVEY RESULTS

Q1 I feel that PBEM Staff are responsive to my concerns.



Q2 I feel that PBEM staff have a positive and helpful attitude.



Q3 When expected at a meeting or event, PBEM staff have arrived on time and prepared.



Q4 My Team Leader has the RESOURCES they need to be effective. (access to meeting venues, materials, etc)



Q5 My Team Leader has the LEADERSHIP SKILLS they need to be effective.



Q6 I am pleased with the current direction of PBEM's volunteer programs.



Q16 Do you rent or own your home?



Q17 How many persons live in your household? (include yourself in the count)



Q18 What is your approximate annual household income?



Q19 What is the highest level of school you have completed or the highest degree you have received?


