Engagement Plan	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Each PCCEP subcommittee is planning to craft their own community engagement plan (budget of \$3,500 each subcommittee)• PCCEP does plan to craft a general community engagement plan• The SAPS Engagement Plan has been broken into three parts (This plan represents how SAPS would like to allocate these funds, with the caveat that the public events/meetings described herein will not take place until the COVID-19 crisis subsides).<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ 1. People who represent community building)• PCCEP member Amy expresses concern for the aftereffects that will occur after COVID-19. Worries the public may hesitate to hold large public.• PCCEP project director Theo Latta suggest having a safe method of conducting community engagement using the Pizza and Policing Policy Workshops (delivering pizza to college students and listen to their experiences via Zoom during COVID)• Concerns for awarding policing individually (where are the nominations coming from?). Suggestion to focus on the behavior of the police vs the person as an officer• Suggestion to view the work of PPB with Sunshine Division as an example of community engagement.
