MINUTES

Welcome	 Welcome question: One thing that brings you joy during this time? A few answers: enjoy taking walks, increasing cooking skills, and watching shows on Netflix.
Zoom + COVID	 Updates from staff on Zoom virtual meetings: Livestream will be available for general body meetings provided by Open Signal. SRI interpreters will be provided for the general body meetings. The steering committee and subcommittees will not be livestreamed or recorded. Minutes will be provided. No password will be required for City public meetings. Staff will take minutes and facilitate meetings. COVID- specific updates: No officers yet to test positive for COVID-19. Portland Police Bureau (PPB) is working with the City to open three sanctuaries areas for the houseless. PPB is working with the Sunshine Division to provide food to the community. PPB is not responding to minor calls. No data has been analyzed for crim during COVID. Shootings are up compared to what the city has experienced. PPB has started a podcast that discusses COVID and other related topics.
Subcommittees Community Engagement Plans	 Steering committee will communicate with subcommittee chairs. Every subcommittee has a community engagement budget of \$3,500. Expectation for subcommittees to draft plans during the month of May. Set a deadline for the community engagement plans to be submitted. Have at least one person per subcommittee attend steering committee meetings and share follow-up information with their subcommittees.



	 The goal is for the steering committee to review plans in May. The Settlement Agreement and Policy Subcommittee will modify their plan, but it can be used as a guide for other subcommittees. The Behavioral Health Subcommittee will need more time to develop a plan as they begin to relaunch the subcommittee as of April 21st. The \$3,500 budget will hopefully be on-going for each fascial year. PCCEP will need to wait for the Mayor's budget to pass. It's important to engage with the most affected communities (e.g. houseless and communities of color).
Fesser Incident	 Follow up on the Fesser incident Suggestion to wait for the outcomes of the investigation that's ongoing currently. The Independent Police Review (IPR) did provide some information at the Steering Committee March meeting. Suggestion for IPR to present their findings to PCCEP and PCCEP could develop a recommendation based on those findings. IPR investigation is still on-going. Suggestion for committee member Elliott to lead on this topic on behalf of PCCEP. With the support of staff and other committee members.
