<b>MYC Recommendation</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Word Is Bond and Multnomah Youth Commission (MYC) have previously worked together on a survey (police perception in the Portland and Multnomah County area). They are both now collaborating with the PCCEP Youth Subcommittee to craft two recommendations for the city.</li><li>• Develop a Restorative Justice Recommendation, reviewing current policies (Procedural Justice).</li><li>• Looking at creative ways for the recommendation to be specific for young people (e.g. how do officers interact with the civilians?)</li><li>• MYC, Word Is Bond, and the Youth Subcommittee are schedule to meet on May 13<sup>th</sup> from 4:00-5:00p - to discuss the recommendation development.</li><li>• Check in with Mary Claire from the Portland Police Bureau (PPB) on who is the most accurate person to connect with for the Bureau's restorative justice training.</li><li>• Once further information is gathered from PPB, crafting the recommendation will follow.</li><li>• Goal is to do a descant amount of outreach during the month of May.</li><li>• Discuss/ review the <a href="#">PPB Community Engagement Plan</a>.</li><li>• Connect with the PCCEP Racial Equity Subcommittee to develop a second recommendation regarding advisory committees.</li><li>• As of now only School Resource Officers (SRO's) are provided with restorative justice training. The recommendation would include offering restorative justice training to all officers</li><li>• Two Recommendations are being crafted: (1) Restorative Justice Recommendation. (2) In partnership with the Racial Equity</li></ul>
