ID Issues	Andrea Meyer of the Oregon ACLU presented information on Oregon's new rules for obtaining driver's licenses and IDs. The rules may present a barrier to homeless people. The federal RealID act is also problematic, but it is somewhat stalled right now. Oregon's governor favors stricter ID requirements. She encouraged committee members to attend upcoming hearings and to contact your state legislators.		Andrea will send a list of suggestions and contacts to Sally.
Sound Families	Jami Bodonyi of the University of Washington School of Social Work presented a PowerPoint slide show with results of the Seattle-area's Sound Families program. The program has operated for 7 years and there is data on almost 1,500 families. Evaluators believe mental illness and substance abuse were under-reported at intake. Financial subsidies were critical in getting families into stable housing. There was a wide variety of pathways to better employment.
