| 50th Anniversary of Fair Housing Act | Suggested themes. Recommit to the big ideas Fair Housing Act, Housing Choice and Access. Connect the history of segregation to displacement and access segregation today. Compare progress since last Fair Housing Plan. Suggest new best practices, and action, services going forward. Use this as an opportunity to tell the public about their fair housing rights. Show the CBS fair housing special. Introduce landlords to newer best practices, i.e. waitlist management, email training. Criminal records, and expungement programs. Show how protected classes are more vulnerable to housing instability and housing instability leads to other issues. Culturally specific programming. Highlight issues like disproportionate lack of use of public housing by the Latino community. Homeless youth are more likely to be LGBTQ. "What is good for you is good for me." | Discussion |
