Discussion points / Trends

Total Precinct / Division completion count for FDCR's was 100% for the 2nd Qtr of 2013.

As you can see from the above statistics, there has been a slight increase in calls for service between 2nd Qtr 2013 and 2nd Qtr 2012 accompanied by a substantial reduction in FDCR's written.

Baton and LL BB gun deployments remain at zero.

Aside from pointing of a Firearm, Takedowns remain the highest contact use of force. Officers are doing an excellent job of describing controlled takedowns (lowering the person to the ground).

Although body strikes are being used in conjunction with takedowns, punches to the face have diminished from the first quarter of 2013.
