## Discussion points / Trends

Three FDCR's did not have a precinct of occurrence indicated.

286 FDCR's were completed in the third quarter of 2013. 328 FDCR's were completed for the same time period in 2012. This is a 14% reduction from last year.

As a type of force used, Pointing of Firearm Only (33%) has dropped considerably from 42% of the 1st quarter and 44% of the second quarter.

Force used on people identified as Transients or have flagged mental health issues rose during the 3rd Qtr, 2013. Analysis of the 4th Qtr 2013 and 1st Qtr 2014 as well as the same time periods of 2012 and 2013 will help determine if this is a seasonal (Summer) increase related to the transient population.

K-9 deployments dropped dramatically during the 3rd Qtr 2013.

Takedowns are the second most common use of force to date and the percentage of occurrence for Takedowns has been slowly but steadily rising during 2013.

After consulting with Precinct / Division command staff, 9 cases were forwarded to Internal Affairs as Internal Service Improvement Opportunities (ISIO) during the 3rd Qtr. There were no force investigations initiated during the 3rd Qtr.
