#### Overview

The Portland Police Bureau is seeking volunteers to serve on its Training Advisory Council. This council was established in January of 2012 by the Portland City Council Resolution 36912 to advise the Chief of Police on training standards, practices, and outcomes by examining training content, delivery, tactics, policy, tools, equipment, and facilities. There are eight (8) vacant positions. As part of the selection process, you will be required to undergo a standard criminal background check. If selected, you will also participate in a series of orientation activities that will better prepare you to be an effective member of the council. Selected members will also need to provide a brief public biography. The application deadline is October 20, 2017.

#### Commitment

The Training Advisory Council meets a minimum of six times a year. Meetings are at the Portland Police Bureau Training Complex at 14912 NE Airport Way on the second Wednesday of every other month starting in January. Members are occasionally expected to commit additional flexible hours outside of regular meetings. The term of service is two years.
