**MEETING NOTES:**

- 1) Officer Haunsperger discussed the SAC web page – [portlandoregon.gov/police/64167](http://portlandoregon.gov/police/64167) – and urged all members to edit and revise their bios in the next two weeks. Bios should be 300 words max.  
Members should also submit digital photos or have photos taken at the downtown PPB office.
- 2) PPB Chaplain Steve Chawick and SAC Member Pastor/Dr. Max Grishkevich announced of the opening of a very first Slavic Church Rest Stop in Oregon City. This is a result of a year-long process and trust building between a local Slavic Church and PPB Chaplaincy Program. Once the final steps are completed, we will provide date/time for the event opening.
- 3) There was a lively discussion of the SAC internal structure, led mostly by Andrey Shulik and Yuri Boyechko. The Media Team subgroup is already in place and has been very active in reaching out to Slavic news entities.

The following additional subgroups were agreed upon:

1. **Drug and Alcohol Abuse**
2. **Traffic Safety**
3. **Domestic Violence**
4. **Crime Prevention**

Members should let Andrey Shulik know of their level of interest in serving on specific subgroups before the next meeting.

Olga Parker offered to serve as a leader on the Drug and Alcohol Abuse subgroup, and Tatyana Bondarchuk offered to serve as a leader on the Crime Prevention subgroup. Subgroups will meet outside the SAC.

- 4) Irene Konev and Tatyana Bondarchuk informed about the very first City of Portland Slavi and Easteran Euorpean Heritage Week Proclamation (see attached)
- 5) There was a lively discussion of alternative locations for SAC meetings. Andrii Nagornyi recommended alternative sites for meetings for the remainder of the year. It was pointed out there is no money in the PPB budge for meeting facilities.

In order to improve SAC visibility in the community, it was recommended that future meetings be held in Churches, IRCO, and ROSS and perhaps in a park in June

- 6) Office Haunsperger briefed the SAC on progress on the DMV Manual Russian Translation. She handed out and asked for comments on the first run of the Russian Translation. It is hoped that the **formal announcement** of the DMV Manual Russian Translation can be made on Thursday, February 15, 2018 at East Precinct.
- 7) Imam ABDULAH POLOVINA led a discussion of the Muslim Council and its relationship with the SAC, and how the two bodies can lead to further interaction, sharing and mutual benefit in future days.
- 8) Svetlana Pell led a discussion of the **City of Portland's Fix-it Fairs** and the need for a Russian translation of the Fairs' flyers. SAC members agreed to share the upcoming Fix-It-Fair Event with a larger Slavic community. The Fair is scheduled on Friday, January 24;
