Those who want to do so should be allowed to voice their perspective without others taking it away by committing criminal behavior

If you are demonstrating, do so peacefully and remember the following:

- Be aware of your surroundings and the actions of those around you. If you are feeling unsafe, leave.
- Report suspicious behavior: Call 9-1-1.
- Listen to PPB's Sound Truck messages. If you are told to disperse, do so immediately and obey these lawful orders. Sound truck messages are repeated on the Portland Police Twitter account for those who cannot hear the announcements.

Criminal behavior hurts our community, distracts from the message and takes away others' rights who are peacefully protesting. Criminal behavior includes:

- Lighting fires, burning materials
- Vandalizing, damaging property
- Assaultive behavior
- Unlawful weapons possession and/or use
- Impeding transportation by blocking streets and vehicular traffic. Pedestrians on or blocking freeways or major thoroughfares is extremely dangerous and poses a life safety risk.
