

## Use of Force

### Examples of changes in training and policies

- Implemented the Use of Force and Performance Board, comprised of citizens and Bureau members to review force.
- Revised Use of Physical Force policy
- PPB added training to include AR-15 into the active shooter incidents. (Added to 2007 In-Service, and did roll call video highlighting uses and advantages.)
- Added training principles in 2007 regarding officer-suspect contact being flexible and adaptable to different environments.
- Added realistic scenario-based training to In-Service regarding contacts for 2007, 2008, 2009 In-Service and 2008, 2009 Advanced Academy classes.
- Implemented changes to the Critical Incident Command system. PPB designated Critical Incident Commanders, gave them training in Incident Command and made them responsible for responding to all critical incidents
- Provided extensive training to patrol regarding Excited Delirium, created roll call video regarding Excited Delirium and sent several supervisors to the *Excited Delirium Course on Sudden death-Excited Delirium and in-custody death conference* (2008)
- Provided 40-hour Crisis Intervention Training to all uniform officers and sergeants
- Revised emergency medical procedures
- Reviewed foot pursuits practice and updated the tactical training and response to foot pursuits. Training was given at 2008/2009 In-Service, as well as put into a foot pursuit training video
- Began tracking foot pursuits and is committed to studying the results.
- Began comprehensive review of all Bureau Directives.
