



Active Transportation Ambassador Application

The Active Transportation Ambassador Program is a rewarding opportunity for volunteers to get hands-on experience in encouraging fellow residents to use sustainable transportation modes to get around in Portland. Ambassadors get an inside look at what it takes to create one of the best bicycling and walking cities in North America, and help make it even more so.

Ambassadors, guided by PBOT staff, assist the bureau in advancing key transportation outcomes in the city through activities like:

- Tabling at fun and vibrant community events and sharing helpful resources and safety information related to active transportation
- Assisting with annual count of bicyclists and pedestrians
- Assisting with guided walks and bike rides for adults and/or children
- Help promote Adaptive BIKETOWN so that people with disabilities have access to bicycling
- Office tasks like data entry and processing, and putting together packets
- Watching video footage to help analyze effectiveness of facilities

As an Ambassador, you will choose which activities you would like to volunteer for, and are expected to commit to at least two events during the 2018 season.

New Ambassadors receive a 1 ½ hour training covering information and skills necessary to talk with the public at community events about all transportation options. The training is tentatively scheduled on **Wednesday, April 4th from 6:00-8:00 pm** at a location to be determined.

We encourage anyone who is interested in active transportation and likes to engage with the public to apply.
