On July 1, 2017, Portland's Bureau of Transportation will implement a revised rate schedule for various temporary right of way use permits issued by the Temporary Street Use Permitting Program.

Among the permits slated for rate adjustments are those for temporary use of the right of way. The following are some of the frequently used fees approved by City Council for Fiscal Year 2017-2018:

<u>Permit Type</u>	<u>Description</u>	<u>Duration</u>	<u>Fee</u>
Sidewalk Closure	Per block face	1 week or a fraction thereof	\$85
Partial Sidewalk Use	Per block face	1 week or a fraction thereof	\$52
Lane Closure	Per block face	1 week or a fraction thereof	\$121
Full Street Closure	Per block face	1 week or a fraction thereof	\$309
Non-metered parking reserved	Per 20ft space	1 week or a fraction thereof	\$25
Metered parking reserved	Per 20ft space	Daily	\$65
Street Use Fee	Per square foot (metered area adjacent to jobsite in conjunction with building permit)	1 week or a fraction thereof	\$0.18

The list above is not the complete list of fees, definitions and details, which were adopted by City Council.
