6:15-6:30 Review of the RFF projects draft list - (Mark Lear, PBOT)

Mark Lear from the Asset Management, Legislative, and Resource Development group will share with the PAC updates on the federal transportation funds for bicycle and pedestrian projects under Metro's Regional Flexible Funds (RFF) program. This is a continuation of a relationship developed in 2011, whereas City staff began working with the two standing City committees to identify potential projects: the Pedestrian Advisory Committee and the Bicycle Advisory Committee.

6:30-7:15 Growing Transit Communities - (April Bertelsen, Francesca Patricolo, Zef Wagner, PBOT)

The Growing Transit Communities Plan is a planning effort by the Portland Bureau of Transportation to identify and prioritize the most beneficial improvements that would make getting to the bus or walking and biking to places nearby safer and more convenient along sections of bus lines 87 (Airport Way), 77 (Halsey), and 20 (Outer Stark-Burnside).

Staff is currently gathering public feedback about specific project ideas (such as crossings, sidewalks, benches, etc.) in the study area to achieve this. Staff is also gathering feedback from the public about how we should choose the best projects from all of the public feedback we receive on project ideas.

This presentation will also provide a brief introduction of the Pedestrian Network Analysis.

7:15-8:00 – Key Issues from the Vision Zero Initiative - (Margi Bradway & Clay Veka, PBOT)

Vision Zero seeks to eliminate all serious injuries and fatalities on our roadways. This update will help PAC members understand the key issues, including impairment and travel speed that Portland must address to achieve Vision Zero. Presenters Margi Bradway and Clay Veka will outline actions PBOT and partners are considering taking to address each of the key issues.
