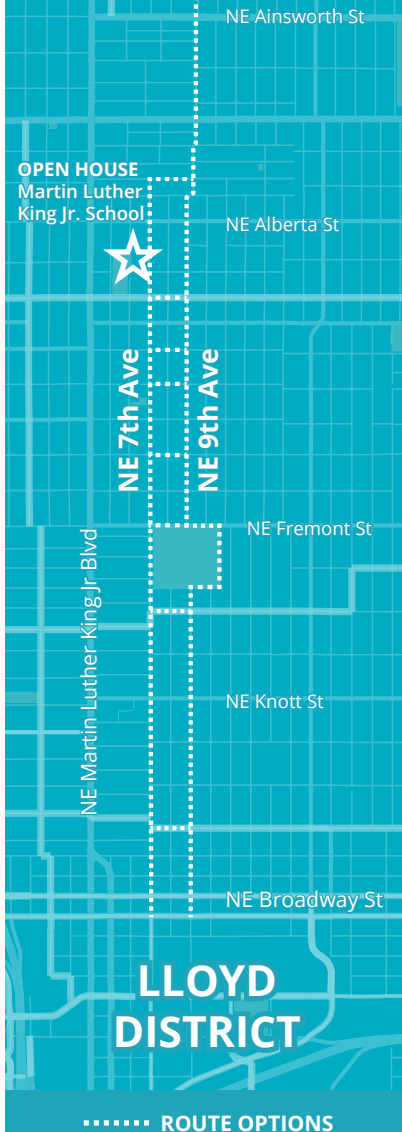
FUNDING
