Nick Falbo, PBOT planner, will provide an update on the Lloyd to Woodlawn Neighborhood Greenway Project, a study to identify the route and design of Portland's next great neighborhood greenway. He will provide background on the project, present the [potential alignments and preliminary design concepts under consideration](#), and share the results of the initial route evaluation. Staff is seeking general feedback on the design concepts and to hear BAC preference for route alignments under consideration.
