

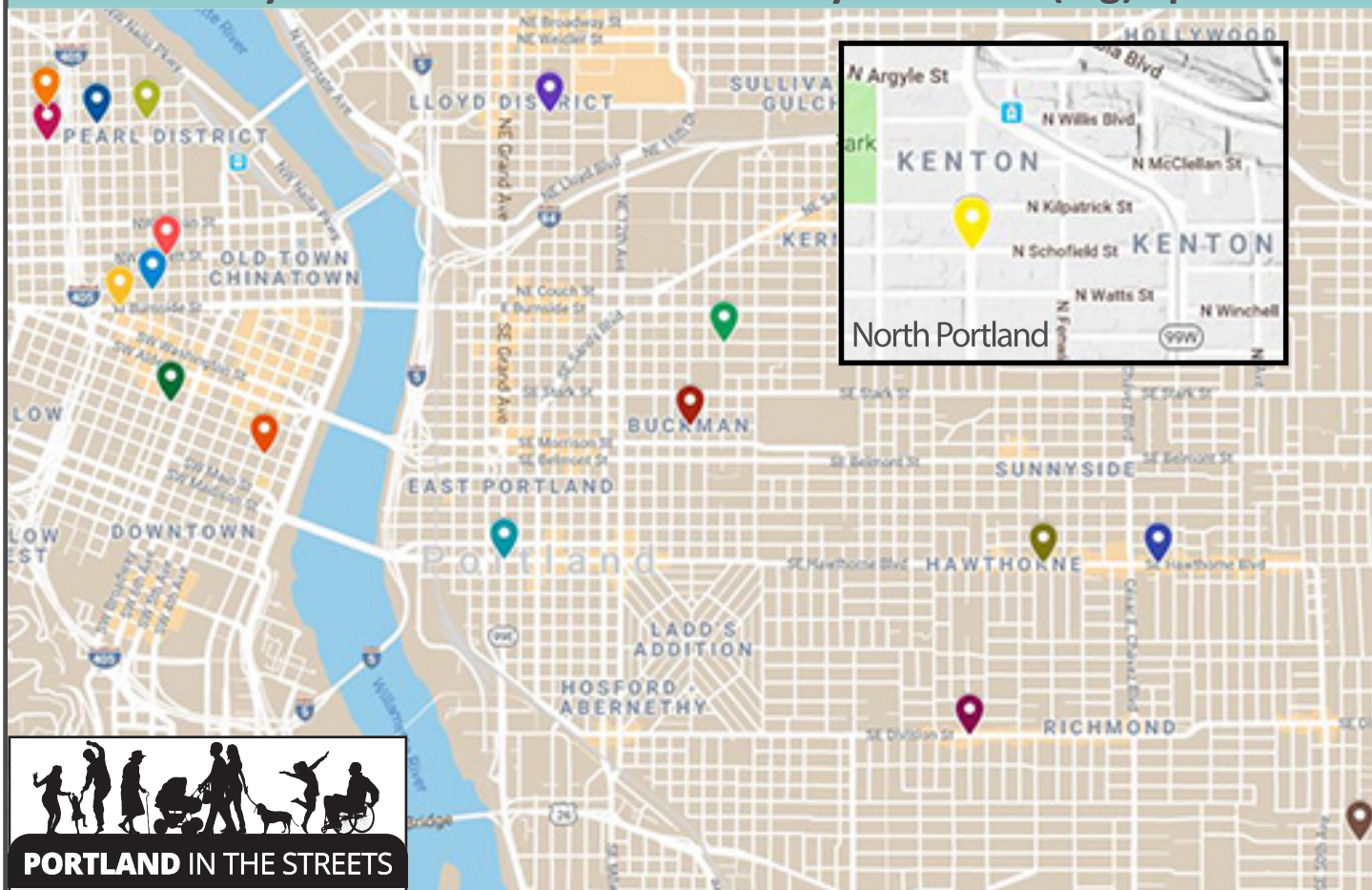

PARK(ing) Day is an internationally celebrated event that has been sPARK(ing) connections in Portland since 2006.

This annual event allows residents and artists to collaborate and temporarily transform metered parking spaces into engaging public spaces. The project began in 2005 when Rebar, a San Francisco art and design studio transformmed a single metered parking aspace into a temporary public park. Since 2005, PARK(ing) Day has evolved into a global movement with organizations and individuals creating new forms of public space in urban contexts around the world.

Check out all of this year's designs, reflect on how public space is used in our city, and consider how shared spaces positively impact street activity in Portland.
