The Lloyd to Woodlawn Neighborhood Greenway Project will expand our citywide low-stress bicycling network in Northeast Portland by creating a safe and pleasant place to walk or bike to employment centers, neighborhood destinations, schools, and nearby parks. The project will improve the conditions for people that walk and bicycle in the area. Project elements include changes to local streets to reduce cut-through car traffic, address high speeds, and enhance major street crossings.
