



HOW TO OBTAIN A LOW-INCOME PASS ON TRIMET

WHO QUALIFIES? Any Oregon resident with an income of less than double the federal poverty rate is eligible to apply. For a single-person household, that is \$2,023 per month (\$24,276 per year). For someone in an 8-person household, that is as much as \$7,063 per month (\$84,756 per year).

You must apply in person at select locations and bring with you:

1. Acceptable ID (one required)

- driver's license (any state or country)
- photo ID card (any state or country)
- passport (any state or country)
- armed services ID with photo
- photo ID card from any foreign consulate
- tribal ID
- US Certificate of Citizenship or Naturalization Certificate (signature and photo)
- any form of photo ID issued by the government of any country



2. Proof of Income (one required)

- paystubs for the last 30 days
- unemployment pay stub or benefit letter
- L & I statement (if you receive workers' compensation)
- Employment Wage Verification
- a copy of your most recent tax return—income verification is based on the modified adjusted gross income on your most recent tax return:
 - Form 1040 line 37
 - Form 1040-A line 21
 - Form 1040-EZ line 4
 - Self-employment worksheet



If the address on your ID is not where you currently live, bring a piece of mail addressed to your current residence.

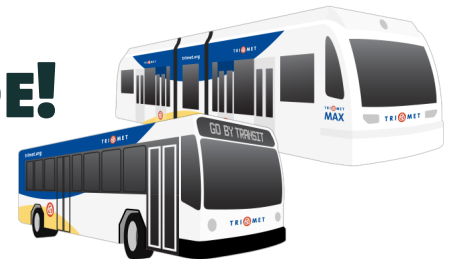
