PBOT is developing a plan to identify improvements on 122nd Avenue between SE Foster and NE Marine Drive. Under consideration are changes to the street cross-section, improved crossings, lighting, signal changes and more to meet the following goals: 1) increase safety for all; 2) improve pedestrian and bicycle access; 3) support better transit; 4) balance the needs with freight and other modes; 5) eliminate serious injuries and fatalities to achieve the goals of [Vision Zero](#). April Bertelsen, senior planner with PBOT will present to the committee the elements under consideration and will be seeking feedback on: 1) [Range of street cross-section options for further study](#); 2) Proposed locations for pedestrian crossings and how to prioritize them; and 3) Overall priorities for near-term construction in 2020.

In 2018 the Portland Bureau of Transportation ran a five-month pilot program for the operation of e-scooters on Portland's streets from 7/23/18-11/20/18. The e-scooter pilot was evaluated against four City of Portland objectives: 1) reduce traffic congestion 2) prevent fatalities and serious injuries 3) expand access to opportunities for underserved Portlanders and 4) reduce air pollution, including greenhouse gases. Briana Orr with PBOT will present the "[2018 E-Scooter Findings Report](#)", discuss the planned e-scooter pilot for 2019, and answer questions of general interest about e-scooters.
