Related to Portland's long-standing efforts to create pedestrian-friendly environments, curb extensions have long been a design element in Portland's streetscape. Brought recently to the city's attention by members of this committee was the increasing conflict and lack of oversight with curb extensions that potentially impede the city's designs for protected bicycle lanes and enhanced transit treatments. Matt Berkow with PBOT will present to the committee PBOT's efforts to develop an administrative rule calling for a pause to the provision of curb extensions on rights of way where they could conflict with other city plans related to bicycling and transit. Matt will be seeking feedback from the committee.
