To All Permitted Users of the Public Right-of-Way:

During the winter holiday season, the Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) does not allow closure of streets, sidewalks, parking lanes, or other portions of public right-of-way for routine work. These restrictions, known as the **Holiday Moratorium**, help support Portland businesses and the traveling public by reducing congestion, providing more parking, and creating a welcoming environment for shoppers and those participating in seasonal events. These restrictions apply to all construction and other temporary uses of the public right-of-way.

The restriction parameters are as follows:

Dates and hours:

- Thursday, Nov. 21, 2019 through Tuesday, Jan. 2, 2020
- Hours of restrictions: 6 a.m. – 10 p.m. all days

Locations:

Exemptions:

- To request an exemption, you must complete a Moratorium Appeal Form at www.tsup.info by Thursday, Oct. 31, 2019. Appeal forms received on or before Oct. 31, 2019 are FREE. Those received after Oct. 31, 2019 will be assessed a \$311 processing fee.
- Limited exemptions may be granted for emergencies posing immediate threats of personal injury or property damage or other non-construction related uses that meet certain criteria.
