### A conversation with PBOT Director Chris Warner

Chris Warner was appointed Director of the Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) in June 2019, after three years as assistant director and interim director. Warner guided Portland's adoption of Vision Zero, the launch of BIKETOWN, the overhaul of private-for-hire regulations and the creation of Fixing Our Streets, the city's first dedicated funding for transportation. He has more than 20 years of public sector management and transportation policy experience at the federal, state and local level, including serving as chief of staff to Transportation Commissioner Steve Novick and transportation policy advisor to Gov. Ted Kulongoski. A native Oregonian, Warner graduated from the University of Oregon.

Scott Cohen was recently hired as PBOT's neighborhood greenway coordinator. Scott has a long history at PBOT, first running outreach campaigns during the transit mall re-construction in 2007, managing the bike parking program and most recently as a capital project manager delivering missing links and other small-scale projects (N Rosa Parks was one of Scott's recent efforts). Scott will discuss his approach to improving neighborhood greenways and their role in the transportation system. He's keenly interested in getting ideas for improving the neighborhood greenway system in our growing city.
